All Is Waiting

Some years ago, I was watching the Rose Bowl Parade on television. For the first time in my life, I saw a man riding down the street in the parade on the back of a buffalo. I had never seen anything quite like it. I have seen buffaloes in the wild, but I had never seen anyone actually ride one. With nothing more than a bit and a bridle, the rider was calmly galloping down the street on this beast. A horse controlled by a bit can render a great service. But uncontrolled, it can do much harm. Similarly, an uncontrolled tongue could be fatal. However, a tongue controlled by Jesus Christ can be a great blessing. But uncontrolled, it can do much damage. Our words so dramatically affect the course that our lives will take. James says the tongue is "a little member" (James 3;5), which simply means that it is a small part of our body. But it can do so much damage. We may see someone with bulging biceps and muscular legs and feel intimidated. But what we ought to be worried about is that little two-ounce slab of the mucous membrane in someone's mouth known as the tongue. It can do more damage than anything else. Solomon uses all of Proverbs 4 to encourage us in word usage. James declares that the Lord gives wisdom to those who request it. (James 1:5) One of my pet pees is, how you talk to people matters. Use godly wisdom as you speak. Be encouraged.


