Know your need:

In Luke chapter 18, Jesus tells the story of 2 men that went to pray but He says one man prayed to himself. Why? His prayer was all about him and for him. It was not about the Father. He prayed, "God, I thank you that I am not like other men who are robbers, evildoers, adulterers or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get." (Luke 18:11-12) Our prayers must be offered to God. Slow down. Think about the awesomeness of the God to whom you are speaking. Get your will aligned with the will of God. The prayer of the other man in the story was given without even looking up, "God, have mercy on me, a sinner." (Luke 18:13) This man thought himself unworthy. This man knew that he was a sinner. This man thought that he needed the saving grace of the Lord. The idea is to find out as Paul did what God wants for your life. (Acts 9:6) The reason? It is for His glory! Know your need. Please join us as we celebrate Black History this year. We have activities designed for all members of the congregation—youth to adults. Here's how you can participate:

Black History Trivia Contest—Questions will be placed in the bulletin each Sunday during the month of February. Prizes will be awarded. All are welcome to test your knowledge.

Famous African Americans Past and Present—Each Sunday during the morning worship service, **youth and young adults** of the church will select a noted African American and share information about that person with the congregation.

Black History Wax Museum (all ages)—Select an African American you wish to represent. Dress as that person and be prepared to present information about that person's life and accomplishments. You may be asked questions as well. You can use props if you like.

Suggestions for your presentation

Begin your presentation with a "hook" to capture the attention of your audience. Here are some sample statements you can use:

- People will always remember me for...*
- My (ideas, novel, inventions) changed the world.*
- I am living in ____ today with my (husband, children, grandchildren)*
- I continue to fight for...*
- Without me the world...*

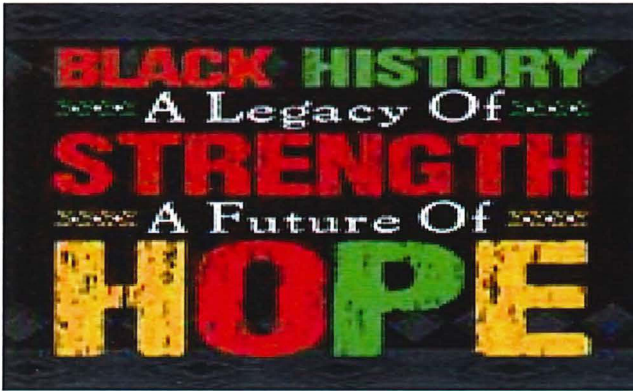
