Know your need:


In Luke chapter 18, Jesus tells the story of 2 men that went to pray but He says one man prayed to himself. Why? His prayer was all about him and for him. It was not about the Father. He prayed, "God, I thank you that I am not like other men who are robbers, evildoers, adulterers or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get." (Luke 18:11-12) Our prayers must be offered to God. Slow down. Think about the awesomeness of the God to whom you are speaking. Get your will aligned with the will of God. The prayer of the other man in the story was given without even looking up, "God, have mercy on me, a sinner." (Luke 18:13) This man thought himself unworthy. This man knew that he was a sinner. This man thought that he needed the saving grace of the Lord. The idea is to find out as Paul did what God wants for your life. (Acts 9:6) The reason? It is for His glory! Know your need. 




