Devotional

Spend time with God:

Believers do wonderful things in the name of God. Sometimes, though, service becomes more important than the Master. Hosea 6:6 makes the Lord's priorities clear: "For I delight in loyalty rather than sacrifice, and in the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings." Although the Lord wants our attention and acts of ministry, many Christians never press beyond an occasional good reading of the Bible. They ignore the Holy Spirit's imbues to spend time in prayer and scriptural meditation. They tend to worship out of a sense of duty. But all Christians know that to become intimately close to the Lord requires time and commitment. Human beings are created to know God. He instilled in us a thirst that will not be satisfied until we reach out to Him for companionship and love. Paul wrote, "More than that, I count all things to be lost in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them but rubbish so that I may gain Christ." (Philippians 3:8) Paying respect to God with our gifts and good works is a natural extension of that design. But our primary responsibility is to spend time with Him. (Psalm 86) Be encouraged. Famous African Americans Past and Present—Each Sunday during the morning worship service, **youth and young adults** of the church will select a noted African American and share information about that person with the congregation.

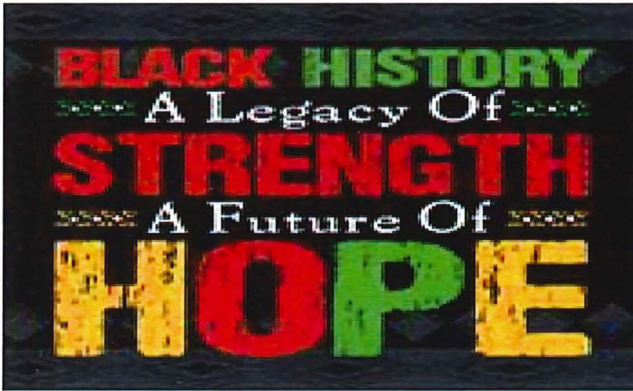
