

### **Devotional**

*Never give up your faith:* 

Darryl Burton, like a lot of young black men, had his GED in hand and was looking to start Community College in St. Louis. He had overcome a burglary charge when the police showed up at his door and charged him with murder although he was not even in the state at the time. As is too often, justice was swift and Burton was sentenced to 50 years in prison. He turned to Centurion Ministries and the bible for help. It took 24 years of patience and prayer both for peace and forgiveness of his enemies before he was released in August 2008. When he had entered the prison there was a banner that said: "Welcome. Leave all your hopes, family, and dreams behind." Now he had to find a reason to hope, dream, and reunite with family. That reason was Jesus. Today Burton has a new wife, completed Seminary, and is now an Associate Pastor in Congregational Care at the Church of the Resurrection, a large mega church in Kansas City. His message to us today: "In Jesus, there is hope, forgiveness, and justice." The Prophet Jeremiah records, "Heal me, O Lord, and I will be healed, save me and I will be saved, for you are the one I praise." (Jeremiah 17:14) Twenty-four years is a long time to wait and suffer the pain of imprisonment. Burton not only found the Lord but never gave up. Neither should you. Be encouraged.
