The Benefit of His sacrifice:

The Cross was the ultimate sacrifice for others. Every human is born into slavery, a captive of sin. Jesus' death paid the ransom, purchasing our freedom with His blood. What that means is that Jesus voluntarily exchanged His glory for flesh because only as a human could He experience sin. Further, He allowed His purity to be violated by our transgressions. In fact, God made Jesus, "who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf" so that we could gain freedom from our captivity. (2 Corinthians 5:21) Jesus took on Himself every bit of sin past, present, and future committed by humanity. Our sinless Savior suddenly and painfully felt the burden of our guilt, the weight of a tarnished our soul, and a wretched separation from His Father. He suffered the injustice of dying for our sin in order that God's holiness and our imperfection could be reconciled in us. (2 Corinthians 5:18) Jesus was the Father's servant, agreeing to an atonement plan that made Him a sacrifice. Jesus is our servant as well. He "for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God."
